Leadership North Houston is a multi-community based program committed to educating and enhancing the involvement of existing and emerging leaders of north Houston.

Program Goals

- Educate, train and provide experiences to enhance leadership skills
- Provide opportunities for participants to develop lasting relationships among north Houston leaders
- Inform and stimulate leaders to solve the significant needs of the area
- Motivate participants to help make a difference in the community and to instill that desire in others

The selection process allows for approximately 30 participants to be selected from the emerging and existing leaders who apply for the program. Please review selection criteria inside.

The 2010 program begins in August with a welcome reception followed by a two-day retreat in early October. Day-long sessions will be held monthly from October through May, as shown on the calendar.

The total investment for the entire ten-month program is \$950, which can be paid by the individual and/or their employer. This fee covers all program expenses including materials, meals and any special travel that may be required. Some scholarships are available.
